When we see the face of another human being who needs help, we are compelled to help them. And help them we do, regardless of their circumstance or ability to pay. JFS has been doing this since 1867, and while we have responded to the times, our basic mission has remained the same: We support children, families, and individual throughout the lifecycle.


