## Ambiguous Loss: Living in Limbo During a Pandemic

## Homeless Services In Milwaukee – What You Need to Know

Additionally, Dr. Lavarda provides supervision and oversight for enrollment into all the Wraparound Milwaukee programs.

As a Clinical Substance Abuse Counselor, where he counsels men. He also is on the teaching staff at Milwaukee Area Technical College, (MATC) downtown campus, where he instructs Group Counseling Skills to students. Mr. Richardson also facilitates support groups at Project Return, a prison re-entry program for men for the last 19years. He provides mentoring and coaching to those that want the help.
