



Fiscal Year 2023 JFS Client Demographics








INCOME

Comprehensive Community Services Helps Naomi Focus On Moving Forward After Trauma

Jewish Family Services, Inc. (JFS) helped Naomi in the past when she was struggling through trauma. She was experiencing domestic abuse, lost custody of her children, developed an alcohol addiction, and began self-medicating. After she successfully completed treatment, Naomi again turned to JFS after learning about our Comprehensive Community Services (CCS) program.

CCS is a Medicaid-eligible support program that helps people improve their mental health, as well as develop and improve life skills to achieve their personal and independence goals. By enrolling in this program, Naomi received a wide array of services from JFS to help with medication management to address depression, anxiety, and symptoms of hypomania (a condition in which a person displays a revved-up energy or activity level, mood, or behavior). This process was very emotional for Naomi, but since working through her feelings in therapy and achieving a therapeutic level of medication, she has become more focused and engaged in CCS services.

Naomi's growth in her recovery has not been possible without community partners. Through the Wisconsin Department of Health Services Family Care Partnership program, she had a hip replacement and physical and occupational therapy to improve her mobility. JFS staff connected her with other resources that helped Naomi with struggles around managing her daily living goals, and adult responsibility skills. She was living with friends temporarily, but shortly before Thanksgiving last year, Naomi moved into her own apartment.

Naomi is continuing to improve her physical health and is applying for social security benefits and exploring employment opportunities. She said that she feels like her entire team collaborates among the different disciplines, and that this will allow her to reach her full potential.



Mental Health Services Helps Cherish Find Healing

Cherish took a significant step by scheduling a medical appointment to address an injury sustained months ago. While this might seem routine for many, for Cherish, it marked a transformative moment with profound significance.

She had sought refuge at the Sojourner Family Peace Center to file a restraining order following a harrowing experience of physical assault with her daughter. As a survivor of domestic violence years prior, her past trauma resurfaced unexpectedly, leaving her in a vulnerable state.

After the assault, Cherish visited the hospital, expecting a thorough medical examination. However, she discovered that her braids had hindered a proper assessment, leading to her being released despite ongoing bleeding from her head. This unsettling experience fostered a deep-seated distrust of medical professionals, amplifying her sense of vulnerability.

Returning home, Cherish grappled with an overwhelming feeling of unsafety. The assailants knew her and her daughter intimately — aware of their schedule, residence, and routines. The resulting fear and sense of insecurity at home were profound.

Navigating the complex legal and emotional aftermath, Cherish was connected with Stephanie, a mental health clinician at JFS, who specializes in aiding survivors of trauma, particularly interpersonal violence. Stephanie's role extends beyond addressing immediate physical and emotional pain; she guides individuals through the intricate web of emotions — distrust, fear, anger, and the feeling of being unheard.

Cherish's journey towards healing is far from linear. It involves numerous ups and downs, progress and setbacks, triggers, and necessary adjustments. However, the pivotal moment came when Cherish, despite her deep-seated distrust of the medical community, scheduled a medical appointment. This seemingly small act marked a significant breakthrough for her, a testament to her courage and resilience. Stephanie takes pride in Cherish's ability to confront her traumatic triggers and navigate through them.

JFS provides advocacy services to support individuals like Cherish. These crucial services are made possible by individuals, organizations, and the Victim of Crimes Act (VOCA) grant, provided by the Wisconsin Department of Justice. JFS stands ready to assist and empower survivors on their path to healing.

Bradley Crossing Brings Stability and Safety to Navata's Family

Imagine having to worry about keeping your home warm in the winter or not knowing if there will always be food at the table. This was the story for Navata, a single mother of two teenagers, one of whom was experiencing a mental health crisis.

After a referral from JFS, Navata's child was enrolled in Children's Community Mental Health Services & Wraparound Milwaukee. This program is a unique system of care for children with serious emotional, behavioral, and mental health needs. Through this process, a JFS case manager discovered the family was living in unsafe and unstable housing, impacting the two teens' educational success.

JFS also referred Navata to our Bradley Crossing residence in Brown Deer, which offers an affordable, apartment style living to eligible families, with a special focus on the needs of individuals with disabilities. The campus consists of five buildings with 114 apartment homes, designed with bright and open spaces, amenities, and planned activities. Navata and her family moved in and found a new level of comfort and community. Navata's younger child particularly enjoyed visiting an apple farm! Navata is continuing her own education and temporary tenant assistance in the form of grocery gift cards donated to JFS is helping ensure the family has access to food.

Navata credits JFS and the Bradley Crossing staff for her family now living a better quality of life. "You don't know what this has meant for my family."

Donor Spotlight

Idy Goodman is a longtime friend, ally and supporter of Jewish Family Services, Inc. (JFS). Her association with JFS goes back more than 20 years, when she recalls joining a committee focusing on housing needs in the Jewish community at the behest of Elliot Lubar, past Executive Director of JFS. Over time, Idy has also served on the JFS Fund Development Committee, Tikkun Ha-Ir, Milwaukee Jewish Federation and COA Boards of Directors. She served on the National Jewish Federation (NYC, 2011-2013). She is also a member of the Leave a Jewish Legacy Society at JFS and currently is a lay member of the JFS Board Fund Development Committee. Idy supports JFS because, as she views it, JFS is **“an arm of the Jewish community that helps those with mental health, housing, social and other needs.”**

Her earliest memories of philanthropy date to childhood and were instilled by her parents. She describes this as an unconscious experience, and “an internal way of being.” Idy describes her parents as being very involved in the Pittsburgh, PA Jewish community, and her first examples of the meaning of Tikkun Olam. Idy first became personally involved in philanthropy while in high school, when she volunteered at a community center serving disadvantaged families in need. She states that her interest in philanthropy was heavily influenced through the example of giving set by her parents at home, “where so much philanthropy starts.” From this beginning, Idy’s passion for philanthropy evolved to include social justice, equity, caring for others, and organizations involved in helping individuals, families, and the Jewish community.

Idy has passed on her passion for philanthropy to her children. She proudly reports they are actively philanthropic in their communities as volunteers and “donors with intention.” Idy and her late husband, Bill Goodman



(JFS Board, 2012 to 2015), of blessed memory, have succeeded in establishing a family tradition of intergenerational philanthropy, as her and Bill’s parents had for them. Idy’s commitment to Tikkun Olam is a cornerstone of her Jewish identity and she feels “privileged to be able to give” to organizations like JFS where, Idy believes, that “as people heal, they become more whole and become their true selves.”

Idy’s impact on JFS extends beyond her financial contributions. Her support has bolstered various funds, including the Ralph Sherman Community Education Endowment Fund, Keshet, JFS Endowment, general operating (annual fund), and Victims Of Crime Act (VOCA) funding.

In addition to being a donor, Idy actively participates in the mission of JFS. She engages personally and passionately with JFS and other organizations by addressing basic needs, healthcare, and the environment. She knows JFS relies on donor support and investment to fulfill its mission because in her words, “we can’t do this work alone.” Idy’s commitment to JFS exemplifies the power of collective action to create meaningful change.
