JEWISH FAMILY SERVICES, INC

The mission of Jewish Family Services is to provide supportive services that will strengthen families, children and individuals throughout the life cycle within the context of their unique needs and traditions. JFS offers a wide range of mental health and counseling services, social services, case management programs and safe and affordable housing to 2,500 individuals annually.

MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

- **Psychiatric Medication Management** available for all ages, Medicare, Medicaid, and ins. accepted.
- **Individual, Family and Child Counseling:** comprehensive psychotherapy services
- **Children's Mental Health and School-Based Children's Mental Health Counseling and Group Social Emotional Learning** is provided at MJDS, Yeshiva Elementary, Bader Hillel Academy, Bader High School, Howard Fuller Collegiate Academy, Seeds of Health and other schools.
- **Survivors of Sexual Assault and Domestic Violence:** treatment of interpersonal violence, assault, and human trafficking. Sole provider of adult counseling services at Sojourner Peace Center.
- **Older Adult Services** In-home counseling/psychotherapy services for Milwaukee County seniors.
- **Mental Health Professional Trainee Program:** JFS offers three clinical training program tracks.

SOCIAL SERVICES

- **JFS is a provider of Adult and Youth** care coordination through the Comprehensive Community Services (CCS) in Milwaukee County.
- **Jewish Community Case Management and Advocacy:** addresses immediate, intermittent and ongoing social service needs of the Jewish community. More than 140 clients each year receive personalized assistance to secure resources to meet their basic life needs including food, clothing, shelter and access to mental health and primary healthcare.
- **Disability Case Management:** provides a continuum of services for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) and chronic mental illness that empower them to remain independent. Last year this program provided critical assistance to 27 people with disabilities.
- **Holocaust Survivors and Social Services for Russian Speakers:** serves these aging immigrant populations to address challenges related to basic needs, physical health and well-being.
- **Community Resource Program:** provides free educational, social engagement and service programs for more than 425 JFS housing residents.

AFFORDABLE, SUPPORTIVE HOUSING

- Deerwood Crossing Senior Residences is a licensed assisted living facility (RCAC) and Milwaukee County's only designated affordable housing and assisted living residence for seniors age 55+.
- Currently 119 people reside in 96 units.
- Bradley Crossing Supportive Housing Community/Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Residences at Bradley Crossing provide affordable, supportive housing for individuals and families with and without disabilities. Currently 246 people live in 114 units, 100 of whom are under 18 yrs. old.
- Woodale Crossing Supportive Housing offers 56 units of affordable and supportive senior housing for approximately 70 people with 14 units reserved for people with disabilities at risk of homelessness.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

- \$180 provides two weeks of care for a person's mental health in JFS programs.
- \$360 provides lunch for one senior in assisted living for a year. \$720 provides a first visit for 15 children who need outpatient mental health services. \$1,000 brings our Late Life mental health services to home-bound older adults for a month. \$2,500 provides a year of support for 3 individuals with physical or cognitive disabilities. \$5,000 provides 35 classroom and small group psycho-educational sessions for children. \$10,000 provides 65 psychotherapy sessions each year for survivors of domestic violence.
